1. CALL TO ORDER: Chair Alejo called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Roll call was taken, and a quorum was confirmed, with six members in attendance (as noted above).

Staff present: Goel, Hale, Muck, Rodriguez, Vasquez, Watson, and Zeller.
Others present: Agency Counsel Kay Reimann; Gus Khouri, Legislative Analyst; and
County Counsel Katherine Hansen

2. **PUBLIC COMMENTS**:

None this month.

3. CONSENT AGENDA:

M/S/C Adams/Lopez/unanimous

On a motion by Committee Member and seconded by Committee Member Lopez, the committee voted 6-0 to approve the minutes from the Executive Committee meeting of June 3, 2020; and approve a cash incentive award of \$150 each for Dave Delfino, Stefania Castillo and Madilyn Jacobsen for excellent performance above and beyond their regular duties.

4. <u>COVID-19 PROTECTION PROTOCOLS AND BENEFIT</u>

M/S/C Huitt/Alejo/unanimous

On a motion by Committee Member Huitt, seconded by Committee Member Alejo, the committee voted 6-0 to approve an additional sell-back of 40.0 hours of accrued vacation.

Committee member Adams made a substitute motion to allow the 80 hours cash out, noting this is a wise decision and reduces the overall liability. This motion failed to obtain a second.

Rita Goel, Director of Finance & Administration, reported an additional sell-back of 40.0 or 80.0 hours of accrued vacation is proposed since employees may be unable to take time-off due to the extra work/cancellation of vacation plans caused by the crisis. Based on a survey of employees, the short-term cost of the vacation sell-back is projected at \$10,997 for an additional up to 40.0 hours and \$21,994 for an additional up to 80.0 hours. However, permitting employees to sell back vacation time will actually save money over time by reducing the long-term liability on the Agency's balance sheet at current pay rates vs. higher pay rates in the future as this is money owed by law to the employee. Additionally, fringe benefits costs will not have to be paid on the hours sold back, resulting in additional Agency savings.

Chair Alejo expressed concern that at this time of the pandemic, it was not a good idea to propose a high sell back. Committee member Lopez concurred with Chair Alejo noting a lot of people were losing their jobs. Committee member Huitt expressed his support for a 40-hour cash out.

5. **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

M/S/C Adams/Huitt/unanimous

On a motion by Committee Member Adams, seconded by Committee Member Huitt, the committee voted 6-0 to receive update on state and federal legislative activities and Adopt positions on legislation on behalf of the Board of Directors.

Gus Khouri, Agency legislative consultant, reported that the Legislature has returned from a short summer recess. Mr. Khouri highlighted the following bills:

- SB 1231 TAMC-sponsored Route 156 salamander legislation approved by the Assembly Water Parks Wildlife Committee on 8/4 — next it will be considered by the Appropriations Committee, then Assembly floor. Caltrans strongly supports. Goal is to get on the consent agenda in Appropriations.
- Requesting that the Committee take a position on two new bills, on behalf of Board due to timing:
 - SB 288 CEQA streamlining for active transportation and transit projects within existing rights of way. – Bay Area Council is the sponsor - support
 - SB 1459 SR 183 relinquishment City of Salinas is the sponsor support
- o Requesting that the Committee change its position on two bills amended since the Agency's prior position was approved:
 - AB 2323 amended previously supported, now recommend watch
 - **SB 1351** amended previously threatened planning funds now Author wants to accelerate funding for state highway transportation projects. Keep previous "oppose unless amended" position to assure that the bill holds harmless transit & competitive grant programs.
- SB 25 (Caballero) revived supported previously, sent renewed support letter 7/16

Christina Watson, Principal Transportation Planner, reported the following on the Federal Legislative update:

- Authorizations:
 - House Reso 2, Moving Forward Act Federal transportation reauthorization proposal with funding for transportation, unlikely to get through Senate
 - Senate COVID bill no funds for transit/transportation except airports

- Appropriations: Transportation, Housing and Urban Development funding legislation passed House Appropriations on July 8,2020
- Other: Senate bill "Build Local Hire Local" which would reinstate the ability to give a local firm preference is now stalled since introduction a year ago

Subject: Legislative Update

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

RECEIVE update on state and federal legislative activities and **ADOPT** positions on legislation on behalf of the Board of Directors.

SUMMARY:

Staff will present an updated draft bill list and an update on state and federal legislative activities.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Some bills on the list may impact TAMC finances, particularly in relation to Measure X revenues.

DISCUSSION:

Attached online are a state update from Agency legislative consultant Gus Khouri and an updated draft bill list. One addition from the list adopted by the TAMC Board of Directors on August 26, 2020 is shown in underline:

• SB 146 (Beall) would provide an exemption from in-person meetings as required by the Brown Act, through January 1, 2023, in order to allow for virtual public participation for informational hearings related to the construction of a sustainable communities strategy by metropolitan planning organizations. TAMC staff is recommending a support position.

One bill, SB 1351 (Beall), was amended since the Board adopted an "oppose unless amended" position to remove the Agency's opposition. SB 1351 would allow a portion of the Transportation Improvement Fee (TIF) to be used as collateral for the issuance of a revenue bond to expedite highway projects. TAMC requested that the author restrict the payment of the bond debt service to only the portion of the TIF that funds the State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP), leaving the competitive programs harmless. The author has taken that amendment. As a result, TAMC staff is recommending a position change from "oppose unless amended" to "watch".

The TAMC-sponsored bill, Senate Bill 1231 by Senator Monning, which will allow the California Department of Fish and Wildlife to issue an incidental take permit for the Santa Cruz Long-toed Salamander for the purpose of enabling Caltrans to construct the State Route 156 West corridor project, passed the Assembly Appropriations Committee on August 11 and is on the consent calendar for the Assembly Floor on August 24. Staff is soliciting letters to the Governor asking for his signature.

Staff will provide a verbal update on all activities at the meeting.
