PROJECT BENEFITS

- ▶ Provides an alternative for bicyclists and pedestrians to the narrow and uncomfortable shoulders of high speed Highway 1
- ▶ Provides trail users with links between activities in the Moss Landing area and those planned for the North Harbor area and nearby beaches
- ▶ Provides rich opportunities for interpretation and scenery.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION



The Monterey Bay Sanctuary Scenic Trail will be a bicycle and pedestrian pathway that spans the entire coast of the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary, from Pacific Grove to Santa Cruz. The Moss Landing segment between Moss Landing Road and Jetty Road is about 1.17 miles in length. It has been partially implemented, with approximately 0.8 miles of trail left to be constructed. The proposed trail segment would be constructed partly within State right of way for Highway 1 and partially in easements from property owners.
