- NEPA (federal) initiated coordination with FTA

SURF! PROJECT PROGRESS

Coordination with Partners

US DOT and Federal Transit Administration – consultation with US Fish and Wildlife, access to Capital Investment Grants (\$\$\$)

Caltrans – small slivers of right-of-way inside Caltrans property, requires coordination and approvals

California Coastal Commission – Coastal permit needed

County of Monterey, Marina, Sand City, California State Parks and Seaside
