#### 4. AMBAG DRAFT 2023 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLAN

Chris Duymich, Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments (AMBAG) presented on the federally required 2023 Public Participation Plan that is a comprehensive document that guides regional planning agencies and local juridictions in the public participation process for the tri-county Monterey Bay region that either receive federal funds or are subjected to a federally required action. Ms. Duymich noted that the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Monterey Bay Region prepares and adopts the Public Participation Plan at least once every four years. In conclusion, Ms. Duymich reported that the transportation decision making process, including the expanded use of visualization techniques and innovative online marketing strategies in public outreach. She noted that the Draft 2023 Public Participation Plan is out for review and asked to provide comments by August 23, 2023, any comments should be emailed to Heather Adamson at hadamson@ambag.org.

#### 5. **2023 COMPETITIVE GRANTS PROGRAM OF PROJECTS**

Janneke Strause, Transportation Planner reported that the Transportation Agency received twelve completed competitive grant applications, totaling \$22,744,500 in requested Regional Surface Transportation Program grant funding. She noted that each application was reviewed and scored by five committee members. Ms. Strause went over the following projects that are recommended by Agency staff for grant funding in ranked order:

- King City U.S. Highway 101/Broadway Street at San Antonio Drive Roundabout Improvement Project: \$3,519,000
- Marina Del Monte Boulevard and Reservation Road Intersection Improvements: \$1,717,500
- Monterey-Salinas Transit MST Countywide Bus Stop Project: \$425,000
- City of Soledad West Street Road Diet and Complete Street Project: \$2,758,000
- City of Salinas Harden Parkway Path and Safe Routes to School Project: \$1,556,000

Ms. Strause also reported that the Transportation Agency received four complete quick-build grant applications totaling \$732,500 in requested Regional Surface Transportation

Program grant funding. Each application was reviewed and scored by five committee members. The following projects are recommended by Agency staff for grant funding in ranked order:

- City of Salinas East Market Street Cycle Track Quick Build: \$326,000
- City of Monterey Madison/Hermann/Larkin Traffic Circle: \$119,120
- King City Division Street Bike Lanes & SRTS Crosswalk Upgrades: \$117,380

## **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

**RECEIVE** an update on the development of the 2050 the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and the Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (MTP/SCS).

## **SUMMARY:**

The Monterey County Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) informs the basis for the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) prepared by the Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments (AMBAG) for the Monterey Bay Area. These plans are prepared every four years pursuant to Federal Highway Administration and Caltrans transportation planning requirements. Initial AMBAG 2050 MTP/SCS activities underway are discussed below. AMBAG seeks input on the development of their draft goals and policy objectives. TAMC has initiated the development of the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan and staff will present a timeline of the plan process.

## FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The 2026 Regional Transportation Plan is being prepared in-house by staff in coordination with Agency committees and the Board of Directors. The Plan's environmental document is budgeted by the Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments not to exceed \$325,000, of which TAMC will pay \$75,000, and will cover the tri-county Metropolitan Transportation Plan as well as the individual Monterey, Santa Cruz and San Benito County Regional Transportation Plans. The Plan will include cost estimates for transportation projects in Monterey County through the 2050 horizon year. The 2022 Regional Transportation Plan's financial estimate identified a total of approximately \$6.7 billion in projected funding for transportation projects in Monterey County through the 2045 horizon year of the plan.

## **DISCUSSION:**

The Regional Transportation Plan for Monterey County is a long range (20 year) plan, updated every four years. The Regional Transportation Plan forms the basis for the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) prepared by the Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments (AMBAG) for the Monterey Bay Area pursuant to Federal Highway Administration and Caltrans transportation planning requirements.

#### MTP/SCS

As the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Monterey Bay Area, AMBAG incorporates the financial assumptions and project lists included in the Regional Transportation Plans for Monterey, Santa Cruz and San Benito Counties into the Metropolitan Transportation Plan. AMBAG adopted the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (MTP/SCS) in June 2022. Federal and state law requires that AMBAG

prepare a long-range transportation plan every four years. In accordance with state and federal guidelines, the 2050 MTP/SCS is scheduled for adoption by the Board of Directors in June 2026. Staff developed the 2050 MTP/SCS Plan Work Program and Schedule which was approved by the AMBAG Board of Directors in April 2023. Initial 2050 MTP/SCS activities underway are highlighted below, a full report can be found in the attachment to this item. 2026 Regional Growth Forecast

The process to update the Regional Growth Forecast has been initiated. Staff explored its various forecast methodology options to use in the development of the Regional Growth Forecast. The AMBAG Board of Directors approved using the Cohort Component Population Method. This methodology implements a cohort component model for the population forecast that uses birth, death, and migration information to predict future population. 2050 MTP/SCS Draft Vision and Goals

With each MTP/SCS update, AMBAG starts the planning process by establishing a framework of a vision and goals to guide the development of the Plan. Ultimately, performance measures will be developed to measure how well the MTP/SCS meets the goals. The AMBAG Board of Directors will be asked to approve the vision and goals in late 2023.

Transportation Project Database and Project List

AMBAG is currently developing a new transportation project database to track all MTP/SCS projects. In 2024, AMBAG will soon begin work with the RTPAs, transit operators, Caltrans and local jurisdictions to update the transportation project list for the 2050 MTP/SCS. RTPA staff will work with local jurisdictions and other project sponsors to obtain updates to local projects to be entered into the MTP/SCS database.

AMBAG staff will continue to develop the initial components of the 2050 MTP/SCS working with the Planning Directors Forum, Technical Advisory Committees, partner agencies and key stakeholders.

## **RTP**

The Transportation Agency adopted the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) in June 2022. State law requires that TAMC prepare a long-range transportation plan every four years. In accordance with state guidelines, the 2050 RTP is scheduled for adoption by the Board of Directors in June 2026. Pursuant to state guidelines, the Regional Transportation Plan includes a county wide multi-modal needs assessment, transportation policy element, long-range funding forecast, funding-constrained project list, and a program-level environmental review document assessing the probable environmental impacts associated with implementation of the plan. Public participation is sought after in the development of the Regional Transportation Plan for each of the project steps, and as adopted by AMBAG through the Monterey Bay Area Public Participation Plan. Initial 2050 RTP activities include the RTP 2050 schedule, a public outreach survey and the update of the RTP Policy Element. A presentation on the RTP 2050 public outreach efforts will be given at the October TAMC board meetings and November TAC meeting.

Agency staff has developed a draft timeline to provide stakeholders with an overview of the Plan development process. Key dates relevant to the Technical Advisory Committee include:

- **January 2024 TAMC Board Action:** Adoption of Goals, Policy Objectives and Performance Measures.
- January March 2024: TAMC to develop updated project and program cost estimates in collaboration with the cities and the County.
- April 2024: TAMC to present draft project list and cost estimates to the Technical Advisory Committee.
- January/Feb 2025 TAMC Board Action: Adoption of final project list.
- **December 2025 TAMC Board Action:** Receive draft Plan and release notice to the public for review/comment.
- **December 2025:** AMBAG to release Draft Environmental Impact Report covering the Regional Transportation Plan for public review and comment.
- June 2026 TAMC Board Action: Approval of Final Regional Transportation Plan, adoption of CEQA findings and adoption of the joint Environmental Impact Report.


Receive an update on the development of the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (MTP/SCS).

## **BACKGROUND/ DISCUSSION:**

AMBAG adopted the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (MTP/SCS) in June 2022. Federal and state law requires that AMBAG prepare a long-range transportation plan every four years. In accordance with state and federal guidelines, the 2050 MTP/SCS is scheduled for adoption by the Board of Directors in June 2026. Staff developed the 2050 MTP/SCS Plan Work Program and Schedule which was approved by the AMAG Board of Directors in April 2023. Initial 2050 MTP/SCS activities underway are highlighted below.

## 2026 Regional Growth Forecast

The process to update the Regional Growth Forecast has been initiated. Staff explored its various forecast methodology options to use in the development of the Regional Growth Forecast. The AMBAG Board of Directors approved using the Cohort Component Population Method. This methodology implements a cohort component model for the population forecast that uses birth, death, and migration information to predict future population.



<u>Employment</u>: Employment growth by industry is driven by projected national and statewide trends for all industries in the region using a shift-share model with input from the population model through the working-age population forecast.

<u>Population:</u> Fertility, mortality, and migration trends influence population growth. Employment forecast influences migration levels.

<u>Household Population and Households:</u> Demographic factors (e.g., age, sex, race/ethnicity) and external factors (e.g., major group quarters facilities like colleges and universities, correctional facilities, etc.) influence the household population and household formation rates (i.e., the number of people per household).

<u>Housing Units:</u> Housing projections are driven by the household population projection, demographic characteristics of the household population (age, sex, race/ethnicity), household formation rates, and housing vacancy rates.

### Advantages of this approach:

- Consistent with other California COGs.
- Allows closest linkages between model components.
- Produces detailed demographic characteristics without relying on a forecast update from DOF.

The next step in updating the growth forecast is establishing the regional numbers. The preliminary draft tri-county regional employment, population and housing figures have

been prepared and will be presented at the Planning Directors Forum on September 25, 2023 for review, input and discussion. The AMBAG Board of Directors will be asked to accept the regional numbers late 2023/early 2024.

Once the regional numbers have been accepted, the draft growth forecast will be disaggregated to the subregional and jurisdiction level. AMBAG staff will be scheduling meetings with all local jurisdictions, LAFCOs, and the two universities (UC Santa Cruz and CSU Monterey Bay) beginning in early 2024 to discuss and receive feedback on the subregional growth forecast. Draft subregional forecast numbers are scheduled to be available in spring 2024. The 2026 Reginal Growth Forecast is scheduled to be accepted for planning purposes in October 2024.

## 2050 MTP/SCS Draft Vision and Goals

With each MTP/SCS update, AMBAG starts the planning process by establishing a framework of a vision and goals to guide the development of the Plan. This is a key first step, as it is the policy foundation for the MTP/SCS and identifies the "big picture" of what we aim to achieve. Ultimately, performance measures will be developed to measure how well the MTP/SCS meets the goals. The draft vision and goals for the 2050 MTP/SCS are shown below. The AMBAG Board of Directors will be asked to approve the vision and goals in late 2023.

Vision – An accessible and connected region for a safe, resilient, and equitable future.

### Goals

Mobility – Build and maintain a safe and robust transportation network.

- Support investments that are well-maintained, coordinated, and resilient, while improving safety.
- Ensure safe, reliable, accessible, and affordable travel options while striving to enhance equitable mobility options in the region.

Environment – Create a healthy region for all.

- Develop communities that are resilient and sustainable.
- Integrate the region's development pattern and transportation system to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- Develop a comprehensive climate resilient transportation network to mitigate vulnerabilities and enhance adaptation.
- Conserve and protect the region's natural and agricultural resources.

*Communities* – Develop, engage, connect, and sustain communities that are livable and thriving.

- Reinforce vibrant, human-centered communities in urban, suburban, and rural settings to increase mobility options.
- Promote and preserve a diversity of housing types in supportive land uses to improve affordability, accessibility, and choices for all.
- Foster inclusive communities free from barriers that restrict access to opportunity, and actively seek to reduce racial and economic disparities.

Economic – Support a sustainable, efficient, and productive regional economic environment that provides opportunities for all.

- Advance a resilient and efficient goods movement system that supports the economic vitality of the region and quality of life for our communities.
- Improve regional multimodal transportation system infrastructure and efficiency to enhance the region's economic competitiveness.
- Increase the accessibility and mobility of people and for freight.

Equitable – Plan for people of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds.

- Prioritize equitable and resilient solutions in the transportation system.
- Increase transportation opportunities for historically underrepresented and underserved communities.

## Transportation Project Database and Project List

AMBAG is currently developing a new transportation project database to track all MTP/SCS projects. In 2024, AMBAG will soon begin work with the RTPAs, transit operators, Caltrans and local jurisdictions to update the transportation project list for the 2050 MTP/SCS. As part of this required "Call for Projects," AMBAG will work closely with the RTPAs to make changes to the existing projects included in the 2045 MTP/SCS, such as changes to cost estimates and project phasing. Additionally, the RTPAs will be able to add new projects or delete those that have been completed. RTPA staff will work with local jurisdictions and other project sponsors to obtain updates to local projects to be entered into MTP/SCS database.

## **Next Steps**

Staff will continue to develop the initial components of the 2050 MTP/SCS working with the Planning Directors Forum, Technical Advisory Committees, partner agencies and key stakeholders.
